# **INVESTIGATING DRY ICE IN SCIENCE**

Last week some of our Science classes enjoyed seeing some demonstrations using dry ice. Dry ice is solid carbon dioxide, and it has an unusual property, that when it is heated, it sublimates, which means that it skips the liquid state of matter and turns straight into a gas. It is very cold at -78°C degrees celsius, and it burns (uses in everyday life: burn off skin cancers & worts, flash freeze food or lab biological samples, make drinks bubbly, make ice cream, & solidify oil spills to name a few). We saw how dry ice behaves in a variety of situations: when added to cold & hot water; with detergent added; when confined to a small space; and with colour added. Students loved seeing the colours, bubbling & popping, and were determined to see an explosion too! Thank-you to Mrs Tonkin for ordering this interesting substance, which needed to be transported in a foam esky on overnight freight, and used pretty quickly before it sublimated (aka disappeared into CO<sub>2</sub>) gas!)









# 2023 SAPSASA FOOTBALL CARNIVAL

Guluu's Elders tell him to be calm like the water and powerful like the water's current. Guluu manages to overcome his problem with the butcher birds.



We worked on synonyms for angry. We had a word list and chose 7 words and ordered them according to their intensity. The students drew parts of the story where Guluu got angry and wrote sentences incorporating some of the synonyms we worked on earlier.


While you're trying to help your kids and family move through the flu and bugs that are circulating our community, maybe the following could help:

- \* Stay hydrated, drink plenty of water warm water with lemon and honey is good for sore throats.
- \* Rest. So much rest. And this is why you might need help with cooking and chores. Reach out.
- \* When you have the flu, you may not have much of an appetite. So, foods with milder flavours and that are easy to eat like soups, bananas, apples or applesauce, bread and rice can be good choices. But generally, eating fruits, vegetables like leafy greens, whole grains and lean proteins all those foods that are part of a balanced diet can help keep your body fuelled to fight the flu virus.
- \* If you're experiencing nausea or vomiting, eating and drinking foods with ginger may help. Easy options include ginger ale, ginger lollipops or ginger tea.
- \* Sanitize and don't share food or drinks with family members.


