Canberra Camp



It took an extra year, but Cowell Area School Year 8, 9 and 10 students made it to Canberra at last.

Mr Rogers, Ms Robst and Ms Owens accompanied students to a variety of our national democratic, historical and cultural institutions - with a few fun physical activities sprinkled in between, including rock climbing and snow play at Perisher ski resort.



The team stayed at the Ibis Styles Eaglehawk where they were treated to hot bacon and egg breakfasts and spacious shared rooms which were quickly remodelled to look like giant sleepovers.

The tour's itinerary began on Monday with the National Museum of Australia, the High Court of Australia, the Australian Institute of Sport where students were able to watch artistic gymnast, Commonwealth Medallist and Olympian Georgia Godwin train on the uneven bars.









Tuesday saw students discuss their research of local servicemen and women at the Australian War Memorial before laying their poppies and visiting the Museum of Australian Democracy at Old Parliament House before a tour of the gardens.

Sadly, due to reconstructions, time at the Australian War Memorial was greatly reduced in comparison to previous years but students voiced an interest in revisiting the updated facilities one day in the future with their own families.





Wednesday we chased the snow from Jindabyne to Perisher before, on Thursday, visiting Mt Ainslie lookout, meeting with Federal MP for Grey Rowan Ramsey at the Australian Parliament House, following a tour of both the Senate and House of Representatives and their chance to role play parliamentary procedures at the PEO. This visit coincided with former PM Kevin Rudd's unveiling of his parliamentary portrait.













The trip ended with a group tour of the National Gallery of Australia, before students hopped on the bus to go home.





The 2023 camp will attract a PACER Grant of \$525 per student to supplement this year's significantly increased travel costs.

The Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) program is Federal Government initiative which provides financial assistance for students all over Australia to visit Canberra and experience our national democratic, historical and cultural institutions first-hand.

Eligibility for the program requires our school to attend a minimum number of identified sites including Australian Parliament House, the Museum of Australian Democracy, The Australian War Memorial and the National Art Gallery.

This trip began years before students stepped on the bus, with dedicated fundraising over several years by parents and staff, as well as donations from various groups and businesses of whom we will acknowledge in a future newsletter.

As a school, we would like to congratulate our students on their positive attitudes, active learning and impeccable behaviour while on camp.

Thank you to our brave parents Narelle Tonkin, David Kovac and Roanna Frost who provided a little reminder of home and a lot of encouragement on the trip.

Thank you also to the History teachers back at school who prepared our students before visiting Canberra's significant sites - Mrs Peters and Ms Tavender - as well as Ms Bourlioufas, Kylie, Jacqui and Michelle for all their support in organising the trip.


