## **SAASTA Connect Cup Camp - Newsletter**

Our year 6-9 students in SASTA Connect attended the SAASTA Connect Cup camp in Adelaide in week 3.

## Wednesday:

We drove to Adelaide, dropped off Pig, and made a stop at a playground and skatepark before visiting Colebrook Reconciliation Park. Located on Shepherds Hill Road, Colebrook Blackwood Reconciliation Park stands on the site of the former Colebrook Home. It now serves as a memorial to the Aboriginal children and families affected by the Stolen Generation. Students walked through the park, listening to poignant audio recordings of Elders who once resided at Colebrook Home—an experience both significant and moving. "It was a really great experience. All the sites we visited were inspiring...Going to all the amazing Aboriginal sites was a really incredible experience." - H. Frost.

Later, we visited the Native Food store in Marion to explore and experience the scents and tastes of native foods such as green ant jam and wattle candles.

Exhausted, we headed to our accommodation at Regency Park where we engaged in team-building games like cricket before dinner and retiring for the night.



## Thursday:

It was Liam's birthday, so we had a brief celebration before visiting the Living Kaurna Centre. There, we learned about the traditional uses of ochre in Aboriginal culture. The art class provided a unique insight into traditional Aboriginal art and the use of traditional paints. Using ochre, the students created art pieces based on traditional symbols.





Next, we took a tram to the central markets, exploring the vibrant sights and sounds and completing a task to locate Aboriginal foods like kangaroo tail and wallaby steaks.

To celebrate Liam's birthday, we were treated to a behind-the -scenes tour of Alberton Oval. Braydon showed us the various areas such as the change rooms, trophy museum, conference rooms, gyms, and pools. We ended our visit by enjoying kicking the footies and running around on Alberton Oval. Back at Regency Park TAFE, students from other SAASTA Connect Cup classes across the state had arrived. The students made new friends, played pool, and discussed footy tactics for the next day.





## Friday:

On our final day, we rose early for breakfast and boarded the bus to Alberton Oval for the Connect Cup, a 9-a-side footy carnival where students from different schools across the state competed. "Going to see all the amazing Port Adelaide football clubs history and the club itself and kicking the footy on the main oval was fun. Playing with other schools was a fun experience but scary." - H.Frost. Between games, we explored the Careers Expo, learning about scholarships, degrees, training, and post-school pathways. We also had a dance session with the Dusty Feet Mob, experiencing traditional dance and learning a routine. "think the best part was when we went to the dance because it was cool and taught us about the women and how they are close to the water, and used to hunt and gather"- B. Frost. We won four out of five games and felt proud and exhausted by day's end.

In the afternoon, we loaded onto the bus for the final journey home.

"It was really fun and important to learn about our culture and all the different cultural traditions, and overall I think and believe that in the future other students that can go on this trip will have a blast of an experience and learn a lot" - K. Iversen.





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
