Principal's News

Last week Ms Robst, Ms Kelly and I attended two Portfolio Days in Adelaide with the rest of the leadership teams from Central Eyre 2 and Far West. We visited a range of different High Schools and Primary Schools to see how they as leaders have led their school with areas such as whole school literacy, developing consistent teacher practice, student and learner agency, career education and the use of student goal setting, student success criteria and sharing data with them so they can track and monitor their own growth.

It is always great to go out and see how other schools operate and bring back ideas that would benefit students at Cowell Area School.

We also had an information session with CE Martin Westwell about the importance of the Purpose Statement for the Department of Education and getting students ready for tomorrow and for areas/careers that haven't even been invented or created yet. He also spoke about the 4 areas of impact that the Department need to focus on to achieve the Departments Purpose Statement. The 4 areas of impact are as follows:

1. Equity and Excellence

Striving for excellence including foundational capabilities such as literacy, numeracy and digital in all learners, by providing varied, challenging, and stimulating experiences. As well as opportunities that enable all learners to explore and build on their own abilities, interests, culture and experiences. We seek out inequity, eliminate barriers to opportunities and support all students to learn and thrive.

2. Learner Agency

Our learners are empowered to develop a sense of identify and responsibility as they participate in their preschool and school community and are supported to play a role in shaping their learning experiences.

3. Effective Learners

Education must develop children and young people who can learn, not only when they are being taught. At preschool and school and throughout their lives, learners need to develop the skills to be effective learners so that they can make the most of future opportunities and respond to changes in their worlds.

4. Wellbeing

Our learners feel safe, included, and valued. They have access to support, experiences, teaching, and resources to build their resilience and social and emotional skills to positively and confidently engage in learning.

In the last week of school I will be running some Student Voice conferences where students will be analysing their wellbeing data around the areas of Cognitive Engagement, Academic Self Concept and Perseverance and see why they think the data is the way it is and what things we could be doing at school to improve these areas.

Volunteer Morning Tea

Yesterday we had a morning tea in the Library to thank all the work that our marvellous volunteers do for our school. From hearing students read, mentoring, ANZAC and Remembrance Day activities with the RSL, Inter-Church Council sessions and the work with the Franklin Harbour Development Group which have seen students assist in the community and volunteers help out around the school. This opportunity for our students assists with their skill and learning development as well as with the purpose and importance of volunteering in your local community.


