Principal's News

It is great to hear and see the enthusiasm and chatter in the yard around football and netball. Also the large number of boys who have organised their own game of footy every Tuesday night after school on the oval is great to see. A large range of boys across multiple year levels being able to organise, get along and play footy together for a large portion of time is commendable.

We have been continuing our work to ensure that students see purpose in their learning, make connections to the real world and are able to take their school learning into other experiences. We have been having conversations with our learners around our purpose and we would love for you to continue this conversation at home by asking the questions - "Why do you think you go to school, what is the purpose of school?" and please let us know the answer.

ATTENDANCE

The start of term is a good opportunity to mention the importance of consistent school attendance. Going to school everyday matters; absences affect learning, wellbeing and success. At Cowell Area School we have an Attendance plan that is guided by the Department for Education's attendance policy. The attendance policy defines the following groups of students as at risk because of how often they miss school.

- Habitual non-attendance: a student misses 5 to 9 school days/term for any reason.
- Chronic non-attendance: a student misses 10 or more days/term for any reason.

We acknowledge and understand with COVID and illness in the community, families are encouraged to keep their children home if unwell. We thank families for supporting the school in these times. The staff at Cowell strive to provide a holistic education for all children and to support families. We encourage and invite families to have ongoing discussions with us about your child's learning, wellbeing, attendance and successes.

UNIFORM

The weather has really started to cool down and we are noticing a large number of students not wearing school uniform. Cowell Area School does have a school uniform policy which requires students to wear:

Uniform Colours

Cowell Area School colours are Navy Blue and Gold.

Acceptable clothing for winter includes plain navy trousers, blue denim jeans, navy windcheater.

It is an expectation that on school excursions that all students who are representing Cowell Area School are in full uniform.

YEAR 1/2 CLAS

Formal handwriting lessons

- Students practise writing the letter on a whiteboard.
- Students get a partner to watch them write the letter and the partner gives feedback.
- The feedback is on letter formation, spacing and letter position on the line.
- The teacher models the letter formation using the lines that are in the handwriting
- Students then do a row of the letter in their book.
- Some students get feedback from the class or at times they all get peer feedback on their bookwork.
- We also have just put up a handwriting 'ladder' where students can have a go at doing some self-assessment.
- We talk about the importance of handwriting in all learning areas and refer to our success criteria.














We try and do some quick letter formation activities during the week in addition to our formal handwriting lesson. We use an audio recording to do guided letter writing on laminated sheets.




- Reading Fluency
 Students do a paired activity where they take turns reading phonemes, words, and sentences, with the aim of increasing reading fluency.
- We often do paired reads of short texts in InitiaLit-2 and give peer feedback.
- Our aim is for reading to be smooth, like talking, accurate, and expressive. We also need to attend to punctuation when we read.
- Most of the feedback has been verbal. We have a fluency ladder to refer to when giving feedback. The Year 2 students have just started to do some 'stars and stairs' written feedback. Stars are things done well, stairs are things that are still developing or need more work.





- The aim is for students to read each day to an adult at school and we encourage students to read regularly at home too. This term, Mrs James, Mrs Hanson and Mr Combes have been coming in to listen to reading.
- We have a suite of tests we use to measure and track reading fluency. This is the Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills test (DIBELS). The tests are phonic segmentation fluency (Year 1), nonsense word fluency, word reading fluency, and passage reading fluency. All are one-minute timed tests. The nonsense word component tests the student's ability to decode words.
