Year 10 Careers Camp


I am currently in Adelaide with the Year 10s looking at different career options and to expose students to a range of different experiences. I hope Cowell is experiencing the same wet and cold weather that we are in Adelaide!

Monday we visited the Australian Space Agency where we learnt about all the different careers that are available that are not just being an Astronaut. We then visited Academy of Interactive Entertainment which is a University that run Certificates all the way up to Bachelor Degrees in Game Design. Some of the AIE graduates have gone to create and be part of games and film such as, Fortnite, Guitar Hero, Fruit Ninja, Happy Feet and the Harry Potter Series to name only a few of the impressive list.

Tuesday we visited Cavpower in Gepps Cross where we looked around the training facilities for apprentices and the types of careers there can be in this industry. Anton originally started his Cavpower career in South Africa and had positions in Europe and now Australia. This just shows that the Diesel Mechanic skills are versatile and recognised all over the world. We then went to the Sturt Police Station and spoke to the Community Engagement Office who spoke about a career in the police force and the process to go through to get in. DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

In Semester 1, the Year 10/11 Wood Design and Technology class undertook a project to create either a table or a cupboard. The semester began with students selecting their project and explaining their choice. They then sketched their designs and used the program Google SketchUp to create a 3D model of their product. After completing the 3D models, students compiled a list of materials and tools needed for their projects.

During the construction phase, students documented their progress by creating a slideshow or Word document folio. This folio included their performance criteria, comparisons of their design with reference images from Google, photos of their SketchUp designs, costing sheets, and a product record. The product record featured photos and explanations of their work at various stages of the building process.
