Snorkelling with the Giant Cuttlefish by Imogen Moffat Sleep

On the 3rd of July, our class—the Year 8s, travelled to Point Lowly to explore the cuttlefish. I was a bit nervous and anxious about going on this excursion because it was the coldest day of the year so far and I didn't feel like swimming. When we arrived we had to get into our wetsuits and I didn't enjoy this part at all! Putting on the wetsuit took extremely long and a lot of stretching. Afterwards taking off the wetsuit was a lot easier since it was wet.

We were split into four groups and I was in the red group with Mr Burton, Liam, Cody and Ava. We entered the rocky, shallow waters and sat on a big rock to put our flippers and snorkels on. Because I had never snorkelled before, I followed the instructor with a boogie-board. Not long after I let go and swam off, once I felt comfortable. I didn't feel the cold at all! So that was good.

We were told the male cuttlefish are the ones with cool colours and patterns. The females are plain brown and there about 7 males per female. The males have a "dance off" and whoever wins gets to breed with the female (and when they're head to head, they're not fighting, they're mating). I saw lots of males and only a couple females. The males are very big and vibrant, I found them most exciting to look at. I tried to duck dive and it was harder than I thought because the wetsuit kept me buoyant. After a while of exploring and seeing the cuttlefish we got out and got changed. It was a fun experience but I was glad to be in my warm, comfortable clothes!


