# YEAR 6 DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

In Design and Technology we have been working on a number of woodworking projects. In the production of our fish we learnt some new techniques one of them being Pyrography. Pyrography is the freehanded art of decorating wood or other materials with burn marks resulting from the controlled application of a heated object such as a poker.

The steps that we used to produce our fish are as follows.

- 1. We drew a picture of a fish onto a piece of wood with a HB pencil.
- 2. Then we traced over the fish with the wood burner.
- 3. Next we drew a squiggly line around the perimeter of the burned fish with a HB pencil
- 4. We then used a coping saw with careful precision to cut the squiggle shape out.
- 5. After that we coated our fish in timber oil and let it sit overnight.
- 6. To finish off our project we drilled a hole in the top of the wood and hung it up with a piece of string.





# AUSTRALASIAN PROBLEM SOLVING MATHEMATICAL OLYMPIAD

For the last ten years, students at Cowell Area School have participated in the Australasian Problem Solving Maths Olympiad. Students do 4 rounds of 5 questions over six months, each with increasingly challenging Maths problems to solve. In the Junior Maths Games, Amani Franklin and Jed Fullbrook have scored consistently each round to hold equal first at the end of the third round. Bella Piggott is in third place and McKenna Arnold and Mia van der Merwe hold equal fourth.

Aiden Panter has scored consistently over the first three events to hold first place for the Cowell Area School Junior Maths Olympiad. After a good third round, Jessie Doyle is only one point behind holding the second place and Oscar Franklin is only one point her in third. Dane Beach and Bryson Grgurovic share fourth place, but with another five points available in the final round of the Olympiad, the gold medal winner is still wide open.

The highest level is the Senior Maths Olympiad, contested by Year 7 and 8 students. Caleb Churchett and Darci Klingberg hold the first place equally, vying for gold medal in the last round. Chase Piggott and Corbin Starr are in equal third place. They have an outside shot at the gold if they blitz the final round.

Well done to all of the competitors who are having a go. The Olympiad is a tough competition and lots of kids don't score (like Raygun) or only pick up a few points across the four rounds. Perseverance is the key, so keep up the good work.





